D1: Five Optional 1 Day Tours (A/B/C/D/E)

Option A: Seattle City Tour

The Jade City Seattle is the largest city in the northwestern United States, the 15th largest metropolitan area in the United States, and is considered to be the fastest growing major city in the United States, located in Evergreen - Washington.

[Pioneer Square] Seattle's origin-one of America's largest historic buildings.

[Parker Market] Seattle's most important tourist attraction, with the world's largest coffee chain Starbucks first store, the world's most disgusting attractions - chewing gum wall, throwing fish show fish stalls and other famous attractions.

[Space Needle] Seattle landmark building, standing on top of the tower, not only can see the landscape of the entire Seattle city center, you can also see the Olympic Mountains, Cascade Mountains, Mount Rainier, Elliott Bay, nearby islands and so on.

[Chihuly Garden and Glass Museum] led the blown glass industry into the field of large-scale sculpture. The famous American glass artist, Chihuly, is famous for his unique style of work.

[EMP Experience Music Project Museum] is dedicated to the history of pop music, science fiction and popular culture and explores the museum.

[Kerry Park] a <u>park</u> on the south slope of <u>Queen Anne Hill</u> in <u>Seattle</u>, <u>Washington</u>, located at the corner of Second Avenue West and West Highland Drive. That view encompasses <u>downtown Seattle</u>, <u>Elliott Bay</u>, the <u>West Seattle</u> peninsula, <u>Bainbridge Island</u>, and <u>Mount Rainier</u>.

[The Museum of Flight] the largest collection of flight-related collections in the United States, with a collection of 145 aircraft, roughly divided into six exhibition areas, the number of aircraft collected here is amazing.

Option B: Mt. Rainier National Park

Mt. Rainier is the fifth national park in the United States, the first known as the Indians near the tahoma, meaning the sacred mountain. It is the highest volcano in the United States, more than 2500 meters above the peak of the mountain, more than 600 meters higher than Japan's Mount Fuji, Washington is the first landmark, so its stalwart is also printed on the state's license plate. Rainier Snow Mountain has

the largest single glacier except Alaska, as well as the largest ice system, 95% of the park is kept in its original state.

Go to Mt. Rainier to see the tallest volcano of the continental United States by visiting Christine Falls, Narada Falls, and Paradise Road.

Option C: Olympic National Park

One of the most famous national parks in the western part of the United States has the world's largest temperate native rainforest and is listed on the World Heritage List by UNESCO as a natural heritage. The Olympic National Park is the largest original area of the United States, except for Alaska, with a total area of 3628 square kilometers, which is famous for combining the three distinct ecological environments of the coast, mountains and rainforests throughout the area. In the middle of the peninsula stands towering with the magnificent Olympic Mountains, 60 glaciers stretch endless. The tourists who love nature will find the paradise of the dream here.

[Hurricane Ridge] overlooking the virgin forest, walking between the clouds, looking into the 19 mountains of the Olympic mountains (in case of bad weather cannot reach the hurricane Ridge, we will go to the Olympic National Park temperate rain forest area).

[Crescent Lake] is located in the famous 101 highway, because the shape of the lake like a bend of the moon named Glacier carved Crescent Lake has the original waters that make it full of mystery. [Seattle Ferry] In the evening, we will experience the Seattle people's special lifestyle, take the ferry from the largest ferry team in North America to return to Seattle from the Baltic Island (such as the ferry for any special reasons closed or late, we will drive back to Seattle).

Travel to Olympic National Park with visiting Hurricane Ridge, Lake Crescent and many other great wonders of the natural beauty.

Option D: Snoqualmie Falls & Leavenworth German Town

[Snoqualmie Falls] is one of the top ten waterfalls in the United States, whose name comes from the Indian language, meaning the moon, which has a supreme position in the hearts of the local Indians. [German town – Levinworth] is the most famous German town in the northwest of the United States. The whole town is full of Burgosian style in southern Germany. The German town - Levinworth has more than 90 shops, each with a unique style, in addition to the German handicrafts, here also has other European countries unique exquisite handicrafts. There are also many restaurants operating Germanstyle cuisine, such as the German village of famous Schweinshaxe, German sausage and Munich beer, has won the tourists favorite.

The German town hosts 13 large-scale events each year, one of the most famous tourist destinations in Washington.

Visit Snoqualmie Falls before going to the Leavenworth German Town. Enjoy the lovely and sweet atmosphere of this popular small town.

Option E (new): The University of Washington+ Big 4 Ice Cave

[The University of Washington] Founded in 1861, Washington was first established in <u>downtown</u> Seattle approximately a decade after the city's founding to aid its economic development. The flagship Seattle campus of the University of Washington has emerged as one of the world's leading research universities. UW is known for strong social science, business, medical and engineering programs. **[Big 4 Ice Cave]** Big Four Ice Caves is a nice and easy adventure, best done in the summer or early fall. This is a somewhat remote area however and it's governed by the forces of nature. Cell phones don't work and a forest ranger may or may not be close by. So respect the potential dangers while enjoying the beauty of the caves.

D2: Seattle-Spokane-Missoula

[Spokane] is Washington's second largest city and also the northwest inland area of the central city. Riverside Park and Spokane Falls are the city's most famous attractions, while Riverside Park is also the 1974 World Exposition venue.

[50, 00 Silver Dollar shop] is Montana's largest gift shop. It was originally opened in 1951 on the 10th highway shop; the customer is mainly near the lumberjack. The original boss whim, will be a dollar silver dollar set in the wall, and write their own name below, unexpectedly attracted the workers to follow suit, you set 1 yuan, I nail 1 yuan, and have left Under the name of their own, the silver on the wall from one to one hundred, and then by hundreds of thousands past tourists have been this ingenuity to attract the practice, into the store will be a piece of silver on the wall, and write the name that came, So the shop business is getting better and better, fifty thousand silver shop on the resulting. 1956 expanded to Highway 90. As of 2016, the total number of silver dollars in the store has been close to 70,000. It is one of the scenic spots of the 90th expressway today.

Drive east from Seattle along the I-90 and we will reach to the Spokane and visit Expo '74 site. Later stop at the 5000 Silver Dollar collection bar in Western Montana.

D3: Missoula - Yellowstone National Park

[Yellowstone National Park] is the first national park in the United States, but also the world's first national park. Yellowstone Park is known for its rich wildlife species and geothermal resources. The largest lake in the park is the Yellowstone Lake in the center of the Yellowstone volcano, which is one of the largest high-altitude lakes in North America.

[Roosevelt Arch] a rusticated triumphal arch at the north entrance to Yellowstone National Park. Constructed under the supervision of the US Army at Fort Yellowstone, its cornerstone was laid down by President Theodore Roosevelt in 1903. The top of the arch is inscribed with a quote from the Organic Act of 1872, the legislation which created Yellowstone, which reads: "For the Benefit and Enjoyment of the People".

[Mammoth Hot Springs] Many algae live in Mammoth Hot Springs, making the color of the hot spring, orange, red and green. The endless hot springs with the terrestrial Pentium down, and the color is different, forming a colorful big step, the scene is very magnificent spectacular.

[Yellowstone Grand Canyon & Yellowstone, under the waterfall] Here is the Yellowstone Park, one of the most magnificent, the most beautiful scenery. Here, the rapids of the river spray splash, forming two magnificent waterfalls, roaring with the bottom of the people. The first waterfall is 33 meters high, which is on the waterfall, the second has 92 meters high, called the waterfall. At the same time, we will go to the Yellowstone Grand Canyon Best View (Artist Point) to see the magnificent Yellowstone Canyon. In the afternoon, we drove back to Missoula.

We will continue to explore the Yellowstone Park by visiting Mammoth Hot Springs, Grand Canyon, Upper & Lower Yellowstone Falls and etc.

D4: Yellowstone National Park- Missoula

The Yellowstone volcano is the largest volcano in North America that is still active, and it has erupted several times over the past two million years. Spewing lava and volcanic ash also cover the clear majority of the park. Thanks to its ongoing active state, half of the world's geothermal resources are in the Yellowstone Park area. Yellowstone Park is also the core of the Great Yellowstone ecosystem, which is the largest and still near-perfect natural ecosystem in the northern temperate zone.

[Old Faithful] Yellowstone's most famous geyser, it is not like other fountains that broke out without law, it every few minutes, it will erupt once, never make the passengers disappointed. It is always one of the faithful by the world's favorite.

[West Thumb Geyser Basin] Fifty thousand years ago due to the formation of the collapse of the crust, in the hot fountain and lake water, there has been a smoke filled the wonderful landscape, here is equivalent to Yellowstone Lake, many geysers gathered here, formed with other hot springs Yellowstone Different landscape.

[The Grand Prismatic Spring] is also known as the Rainbow Hot Springs, is the largest in the United States, the world's third largest hot spring and one of the most famous geysers in Yellowstone Park. The beauty of the big prism spa is the color of the lake changes with the seasons, the spring, the lake from green to bright orange red.

Around no, we will arrive in the Yellowstone. You will discover the most popular styles including Old Faithful, West Thumb Geyser Basin, The Grand Prismatic Spring and many more.

D5: Missoula - Coeur D'Alene - Seattle
